Interscholastic athletic competition is an extension of the classroom and an educational activity that provides outstanding opportunities to teach life lessons.



This award acts as the Association's beacon to all its member schools, promoting schools that encompass all ideals and philosophies of the Association. With this award established coaches, athletic directors, other school staff and game officials can nominate **student-athletes**, **coaches**, and **teams** who through involvement in exemplary acts or initiatives exemplify the standards of one or more of the pillars of Educational Athletics.
