#### **Un-Played Contests** ~ **Forfeits and No-Contest Determinations**

Please <u>click this link</u> to request a determination of a "Forfeit" or "No Contest" for an un-played contest. All sections must be completed thoroughly. This information will be reviewed by a Seasonal Seeding Committee consisting of the chair or designee from each in-season sport and TMC representatives. Tournament Directors and Executive Liaisons may be present but are non-voting members. All decisions made by the Seasonal Seeding Committee are final. Once a determination is made, it will be shared with the schools included on this form. Every attempt should be made to reschedule the contest on the next available date. NOTE: This form does not need to be filed in the case of forfeits due to a canceled season (Rule 18), over scheduling (Rule 34.6), or ineligible player (Rule 86).

#### New report on student success examines 6 New England public high schools after the pandemic

The Center for Reinventing Public Education (CRPE) and the Center for Public Research and Leadership (CPRL) have released <u>"A 'good life' for every student: High schools</u> <u>embrace many pathways to success."</u> In six public high schools across New England, researchers conducted more than 250 interviews with students, educators, administrators, and caregivers to explore whether lessons learned during the Covid-19 recovery period may lead to more lasting, transformative shifts. The interviews yielded a resounding message: **High schools should prepare young people not just for college or work, but to live a "good life" on their own terms—to be fulfilled, happy adults with stable, family-sustaining incomes, strong communities, and choices about which opportunities to pursue.** Read the report.

Please reference MIAA Handbook Rule 49 for additional school requirements when a student or coach is disqualified from a contest.
