5. 2023 Tournament Review

- Weather resulted in a shift from Saturday to Sunday
- Sarah- Curry College is an excellent venue
- Greg-Tournament shifting to Sunday due to weather caused some issues. Improve communication as we had folks show up on Saturday. Venue is great. Greg had some feedback on the event.
 - At the parking gate, only allowing one car allowed in at a time.
 - No signs for the field
 - No permanent toilets or a locker room
 - Turf is hard on the players, tough to get tackled on
 - Did not have a live singer, just a recording.
 - No one knew where American flag was located.
 - o Food truck wasn't available until after halftime.
 - Handicap accessibility was challenging.
 - Some unruly behavior in the stands
 - Overall thought the event was great but wanted to bring these to the committee.
- Sarah- Accessibility for those who are walking impaired (can we get a shuttle people?)
- Mike- great experience. Feedback on bus parking was somewhat negative.
- No real desire to move away from Curry. Consider Veteran's Stadium as a possible venue in the future.

6. New Business

- a. 2024 Rugby format DRAFT Motion to approve (Jesse and Tom)- 8-0 approved
- b. Margin of victory for rugby (currently 10)

- Jesse- Happy with 10 as MOV. Gives more flexibility in the last few minutes of a game. Allows you to put in more subs and not worry about winning by larger number.
- Tom- rankings look fine with 10-0
- Ryan- MIAA needs to move away from MOV, only hurting kids at the end of the bench. Playing into decision making by coaches.
- Peter- still think we are trying to grow the boys game. Why don't we allow as many boys teams to qualify as
 weeks we have to play the tournament? Minimum of 8 teams in D1 and D2? What did girls ice hockey do when
 it was an emerging sport?
- Jesse- Indiana allowed all teams in the postseason but I have grown to appreciate the aspiration and goal/accomplishment of making the playoffs? At this point, would not be in favor of expanding number. The quality of rugby is excellent under the current system/cut off point.
- Grace- agrees with Jesse that the importance of qualifying criteria is important. Helps with goal setting and keeps rugby on the same playing field as all other sports.

c. Future cut-off dates-

- Discussion on making cut-off dates on Sunday? Or Saturday? Instead of Monday, to allow bracket release on Monday.
- Feedback is that no one plays on Sunday, so make cut-off on Saturday. Allows teams to play the following week, per limitation of 1 match per week in rugby.
