

HOW TO BECOME A CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK OFFICIAL

Are you interested in being a high school and or middle school cross-country & track official?

REQUIREMENTS: 18 years old and have finished high school and have an interest in officiating track and field athletics. Prior experience in track - as an athlete or coach - is useful, but not necessary.

MEETS: Most meets (boys and girls) for Cross-Country are in September & October; for Indoor Track in December, January, and February; and for Outdoor Track in April and May. Most meets are held at or near local high schools in the afternoon after school, Monday through Friday; and some are held on Saturday's. The MIAA recommended fee can be found in the MIAA Handbook, Rule 91.

Many schools pay a fee and 1/2 for double dual coed meets and tri-meets.

PROCESS:

1 - Contact person listed below from the area where you live or where you would officiate and receive an application:

2 - Fill out application (usually \$10 fee) and receive National Federation Track & Field and Cross Country Rule Book.

3 - Submit application and take an open book exam that must be passed.

4 - Pay annual dues (as set by local association) and attend at least 1 regular meeting and meet other requirements of your local association.

HOW TO BE ASSIGNED: Schools belong to Leagues who in many cases have their own assignor/commissioner. Your local association will have access to names and numbers (e-mail addresses) for you to contact.
